1. **STUDY VISITS WITH THE COURT**

Presentation

The study visits will be organised at the Court of Justice of the European Union. The aim of these visits is to provide a deeper knowledge on the powers, organisation and functioning of the Court.

The study visit will focus on:

- Presentations on the Court's competencies, procedures, and case law
- Participation in a Court hearing

Requirements

To participate in study visits at the CJEU, you need to be:

- A judge, prosecutor, court/prosecution staff or judicial trainer

2. STUDY VISITS WITH THE EUROPEAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS (ECtHR)

Presentation

The study visits will be organised in collaboration with the European Court of Human Rights. The aim of these visits is to provide a deeper knowledge of the Court, its functioning and its case law.

The study visits includes:

- Presentations on the Court's competencies, procedures, and case law
- Possibility to attend a hearing session (to be confirmed)
- Meeting with a Judge from the Court
- Presentation of the HELP Programme of the Council of Europe and the Commissioner for Human Rights
- Presentation of the European Ombudsman
- Visit to the European Parliament

Requirements

3. STUDY VISIT WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION INSTITUTIONS

Presentation

The study visit will be organised with the European Commission, the Council of the European Union, the European Parliament and the European Anti-fraud Office (OLAF). The study visit is designed to provide beneficiaries with an insight into the EU law making process and the host institution's functioning and procedures. The role of OLAF is also explained.

Presentation

This visit aims at raising the participants' awareness of the role of Eurojust and its organisation as well as increasing their understanding of the powers given to Eurojust National Members and judicial cooperation instruments in criminal matters. A visit to Europol and to the International Criminal Court will also be organised.

Requirements

- A prosecutor or investigating judge
- Court/prosecution staff working with criminal issues

5. STUDY VISIT WITH THE EUROPEAN UNION AGENCY FOR FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS (FRA)

Presentation

The study visit will be organised with the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) in Vienna, Austria. It will be complemented by a visit at the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC). The aim of the study visit is to introduce the participants to the work of the visited institutions in the judicial context. Among the topics tackled will be the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights, FRA's work in the area of Non-Discrimination, LGBTI, Access to Justice, Asylum and Migration, Hate Crime, the Rights of the Child and Data Protection.

Requirements

To participate in this study visit, you need to be:

- a judge, prosecutor, court staff/prosecution or judicial trainer

6. STUDY VISIT WITH THE HAGUE CONFERENCE ON PRIVATE INTERNATIONAL LAW (HCCH)

Presentation

This visit aims at giving an insight to practitioners of the EU MS working about the main instruments of the Hague Conference on Private International Law (Conventions, Protocols and Principles) in the area of **international family law**. The visit will cover the Conventions on the civil aspects of international child abduction, the protection of children and cooperation in respect of intercountry adoption, the jurisdictions applicable law, recognition, enforcement, cooperation in respect or parental responsibility and measures for the protection of children, the international recovery of child support and other forms of family maintenance as well as the protocol on the law applicable to maintenance obligations. The visit will also provide for EU law perspective and relations between The Hague Conventional system and the EU law system.

Requirements

- A family judge or prosecutor working with family-law issues
- A court staff working with family-law issues
